

How to leave a gift to NIWRA in your will

Including a gift in your will is simple.

When creating or updating your will, in addition to taking care of your loved ones, you can include a gift to North Island Wildlife Recovery Association. This is known as a bequest, and your estate will receive a charitable tax receipt as a result. Some of the most common types of bequests are shown below.

Codicil

If you have an existing will but would like to name North Island Wildlife Recovery
Association as a beneficiary, you can do so by adding a codicil. A codicil is an amending document that changes or removes an existing provision, or it can add an entirely new one.
Codicils are signed and witnessed in the same way wills are and are kept with the will. If your changes are major, you should seek professional advice to determine whether you should have a new will drawn up.

Specific gifts

Specific gifts designate a specific dollar amount to be donated to North Island Wildlife Recovery Association.

Sample wording for a specific gift
"I give to North Island Wildlife Recovery
Association the sum of \$_____ to be used
at the discretion of the organization."

Residual gifts

Residual gifts designate North Island Wildlife Recovery Association as the beneficiary of part, or all, of your estate – but **ONLY AFTER** all debts, taxes, administrative expenses and specific other bequests have been paid. A residual bequest is a good choice if you are unsure of the size of your estate.

Sample wording for a residual gift

"I give to North Island Wildlife Recovery Association all (or_____%) of the residue of my estate to be used at the discretion of the organization."

(Note that 'residue' means 'remainder')
